



Applying for an FCC Registration Number

1. The FCC currently provides two methods at two different websites that can be used to apply for an FCC Registration Number (FRN).
 - a. Method 1 (the legacy method) - Using this method, the applicant can register and receive an FRN fairly quickly.
 - b. Method 2 - This method has been in effect for several years and was supposed to replace the legacy method on 1 March 2019, but it has not. Both methods remain operational.
 - (1) The new method takes a little longer, is a bit more cumbersome but is more secure.
 - (2). The new method requires the applicant to first register with CORES and create a username (your e-mail address) and password.
 - (3) The registrant will be required to confirm their e-mail address by responding to a computer-generated e-mail from the FCC.
 - (4) Once the e-mail address is confirmed, the applicant can apply for an FRN. Applying for an FRN at this point is fairly quick.
2. Acquiring an FRN using Method 1.
 - a. Go to this website: <https://apps.fcc.gov/coresWeb/publicHome.do>
 - b. Click on "Register" - a new screen will be displayed.
 - c. There are two defaults selected. Change the first default from "A business" to "An individual" and leave the second default (Yes) unchanged. Click on "Continue".
 - d. A new screen will appear, fill in the required information and click on "Submit". Your FRN will be displayed.
 - (1) Write down your FRN and save it.
 - (2) The FRN password can be used to update your FRN registration information at a later date if necessary.
 - (3) Updating your FRN information does not update your license information.
3. Acquiring an FRN using Method 2.
 - a. Go to this website: <https://apps.fcc.gov/cores/userLogin.do>
 - b. Before you can apply for an FRN you must register a Username and Password.

c. Step 1 - Register a Username.

(1) Click on “**Register**”

Provide the required information and any optional information you may choose to include.

- **Your Username is your e-mail address.** *If you don't have an e-mail address, there are alternative methods for acquiring an FRN that are discussed later on in this document.*
- Your password (12-15 characters)
- Your name
- Your phone number (10-digits)
- Select a security question and provide the answer.

(2) Click on “**Create Account**”

(a) Almost immediately after you click on “Create Account” you will receive an e-mail containing an e-mail address verification link. **You must verify your e-mail address within 24 hours.**

(b) Go to your e-mail account, find the e-mail from the FCC and click on the verification link.

(c) Once you have verified your e-mail address, you can log into CORES and apply for an FRN.

d. Step 2 – Log into CORES.

(1) Enter your Username and Password


(2) Click on “**Login**”

You will immediately see the following menu:

Select one of the following:	
Associate Username to FRN	Link your registered username to an existing FRN.
Manage Existing FRNs	View and perform additional actions upon your registered FRNs.
Register New FRN	Register and receive a new FRN (including Restricted Use Frn).
Reset FRN Password	Reset/update your FRN password.
Search for FRN	Search for public FRN information.
Update Username Profile	Update your username profile.

e. Step 3 – Apply for an FRN.

Click on “**Register New FRN**” – you will see the following screen:


